# WEFTEC Celebrates 80 Years

### 2007 EVENT BRINGS THE LATEST IN WATER AND WASTEWATER SOLUTIONS TO SAN DIEGO

Water and wastewater professionals from across the nation and abroad are gearing up for the 80th annual Water Environment Federation Technical Exhibition and Conference (WEFTEC.07).

Exhibition planners expect to host more than 17,000 guests and 1,000 exhibitors at this year's show, which will be held Oct. 13 to 17 at the San Diego Convention Center. WEFTEC is the largest water quality event in North America and the largest annual water quality exhibition in the world.
